Named for an Irish drinking song, "Jug o' Punch" is an Irish-American band composed of four friends from the Albuquerque session scene. We play and sing from the repertoire of music which developed as the Irish moved over the seas from Ireland to America in the 18th and 19th centuries and which still flourishes there today. Scott Ware on guitar; Suzanne Taichert on harp, bass and keyboard; Rob Huffman on flute, mandolin and guitar; and Cleve Sharp on flutes, whistles and bodhran hope to deliver "triple distilled Irish-American fun" for your entertainment.

Terry Clements, Roger Eaton and Richard Bray return with their welcoming blend of traditional, original and gospel songs along with selections from Terry's 2020 album, "Full Sandia Moon." Come enjoy an evening of music with us.

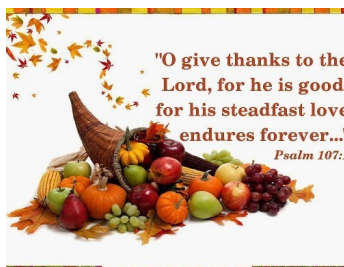
